# YORKSHIRE COMPETITION STRUCTURE AND ELIGIBILITY 2026

This applies except for Excel Grades and BG competitions where BG Eligibility rules apply.

## YORKSHIRE INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY

Grades - Yorkshire WA Gymnastics follows BG eligibility rules for all grades, gymnasts can only pass one grade in each year. Grades competitions will be held within the region once per year except for Excel Grades.

A second opportunity to take or resit Excel Grade 1 and 2 is offered if there is demand and it is feasible in the summer. If a second opportunity to take or resit an Excel Grade is provided, medals will not be issued. Please refer to the BG Grades handbooks for details of criteria.

Classic Challenge, BG Voluntary Levels and Yorkshire WA Pewter © 2023 Yorkshire WA Gymnastics follows BG eligibility rules, gymnasts can only enter as individuals into one Classic Challenge, Yorkshire WA Pewter © 2023 Competition or one FIG Development Level in each year. Gymnasts may only enter the FIG Development Levels if they have met the BG criteria for eligibility. N.B. Gymnasts may enter Yorkshire WA Pewter © 2023 Participation and a Classic Challenge competition. See Yorkshire WA Pewter © 2023 Participation guidelines.

FIG Scoring opportunities for Regional representation (DSE's) - Gymnasts may enter either the Yorkshire FIG teams or as an individual for an FIG score in the Summer. As the individual scoring event is a non-medal event the entry fee is £25.

The Yorkshire Open is now available for all to enter and is a second FIG scoring event for regional representation as one of the DSE's, as this is a medal winning event the entry fee is £30 as per all competitions.

Adults' competition's © 2026 Yorkshire WA follow the Adult British Rules aged 18+, Competitors must be a member of a Yorkshire club and have Community membership and provide a Coach and must have not competed in any other Yorkshire regional events, adult entries are included in the clubs' judging quotas.

Adults Open © 2026 Subject to numbers permitting Yorkshire non-affiliated Adults can enter in our Adults Competition, on a separate deadline that prioritises the region first and foremost. Clubs will need to provide a coach and a judge for their entry to be accepted, and gymnasts will need a minimum of Community membership.

## OTHER RESTRICTIONS

Gymnasts who have **competed** at British Championships in 2026 can only enter a minimum of Yorkshire FIG teams and the Yorkshire Open in that year. All gymnasts are subject to restrictions listed in the BG handbook.

**The WTC welcomes appeal's regarding gymnast eligibility should there be extenuating circumstances.**

## YORKSHIRE TEAM COMPETITIONS AND ELIGIBILITY

Yorkshire team competitions will use the BG Classic Challenge criteria.

Gymnasts may only be entered to represent their club in **ONE** Yorkshire WAG team competition per year. Team competitions are competitions between clubs rather than individual gymnasts. As such the Yorkshire WA Team Eligibility rules are designed to ensure that teams are a fair representation of the clubs who are competing.

Clubs are eligible to enter gymnasts to represent them in a Yorkshire team competition if the gymnasts meet the age and level requirements for that competition.:

NB. The current team structure does allow for overlap of ages on age groups and in the event a club still cannot make a team they are permitted to use younger gymnasts to make up a team.

E.g. a team of 6 can have no more than 2 under-age gymnasts, a team of 5, 2 under-age gymnasts and a team of 4, one underage gymnast.

**Any team breaching the above rules may be disqualified and any awards passed to the next eligible team.**

## YORKSHIRE WA NOVICE COMPETITIONS

Yorkshire does not run separate county competitions due to the uneven distribution of clubs within the counties. Instead, in 2026 Yorkshire WA Gymnastics will be running a Yorkshire Pewter Participation Event and a Yorkshire Pewter Competition.

Gymnasts who have entered the Yorkshire Pewter Teams Competition or the Yorkshire Pewter Participation MAY enter Yorkshire Classic Challenge individual competitions in the same calendar year.

Gymnasts may only enter Pewter and Classic Challenge competitions providing the gymnasts are a minimum of 7 years old in the calendar year for Pewter and minimum age 8 for Classic Challenge. Gymnasts may enter Pewter Participation providing the gymnasts are a minimum of 7 years old in the calendar year.

Yorkshire Pewter events are aimed at novice gymnasts who are not yet ready for Tin Individuals.

**The WTC have left it to coaches' discretion to select the best competition for their gymnasts. Gymnasts can be entered into any appropriate team level regardless of their individual competition or grade in 2026 unless BG eligibility rules apply. Coaches are encouraged and expected to use suitable discretion and judgement when entering gymnasts to ensure that they are entered into the most appropriate events.** N.B. BG does not allow Excel Pathway gymnasts to enter Classic Challenge either as an individual or as part of a team.

## NATIONAL FINAL ELIGIBILITY

Gymnasts are eligible to represent and be a part of the Yorkshire Team at the Classic Challenge Gold, Silver and Bronze national finals if they have placed accordingly in Yorkshire's qualifying competitions.

Gymnasts are eligible to represent and be a part of the Yorkshire Team at the NDP and Excel Grades and FIG Development finals where these are offered by BG, if they have attained the appropriate score for the grade and placed accordingly in Yorkshire's qualifying competitions.

Gymnasts are eligible to enter as an individual in these competitions where national finals are offered by BG and gymnasts meet the qualification criteria; however, where applicable, individual entries do not represent Yorkshire.

**The region is driving for improvement nationally and is encouraging gymnasts to be capable and ready before being put forward nationally. As a guide, please refer to BG Scoring app to see the quality of the Nation's gymnasts to help you decide the most ideal level for your gymnasts.**

## AGE GROUPS

Competitions' age groups will be determined by the number of gymnasts entered. Age groups with large numbers of competitors maybe split prior to the competition after entries have been received, at the discretion of the competition organisers. These will be published on the final schedule.

## AGE OF GYMNASTS

All ages are for the gymnast's age in the year of competition. For example, in 2026, a child born 01/01/17 is classed as 9, as is a child born 31/12/17. Gymnasts must compete in the correct age group for competitions other than where an exception is used to make up a team. The minimum age of gymnasts competing in regional competitions is 8 years old in the year of the competition. For 2026 this will be gymnasts born in 2018. N.B. In all circumstances and all competitions, individual and teams, all gymnasts must always meet the minimum age for that competition to be entered.

# 2026 PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

## YORKSHIRE PEWTER PARTICIPATION

This event is not a competition; no scores or medals will be awarded. The event is for gymnasts to experience performance and to show and celebrate progress. Gymnasts will have their performance verified by a judge and will receive a certificate and an award for participation. Gymnasts born 2019 may attend this event. **N.B. A 3-piece option is available at this event. Gymnasts may participate on Bronze BG Membership.**

## YORKSHIRE PEWTER © 2023 COMPETITION, CLASSIC CHALLENGE, FIG DEVELOPMENT AND FIG

Overall, Medals of Gold Silver and Bronze will be awarded for the first 3 places.

The Overall Gold medal winner will be awarded an individual trophy.

4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> place overall ribbons will be awarded.

Apparatus medals Gold Silver and Bronze will be awarded for the first 3 places on each piece.

## CLASSIC CHALLENGE TEAMS – FIG TEAMS

Overall Team Medals of Gold Silver and Bronze will be awarded for the first 3 team places.

The winning team will be awarded the appropriate Yorkshire trophy for 1 year and will be awarded an additional trophy for the club to keep.

## PREPARATION, DEVELOPMENT, PERFORMANCE AND EXCEL GRADES (excluding the resit Excel grades)

Overall Medals of Gold Silver and Bronze will be awarded for the first 3 places including in competitions of only 3 gymnasts.

4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> place overall ribbons will be awarded.

Apparatus medals will not be awarded.

## YORKSHIRE TROPHIES

It is the responsibility of the recipient club to arrange for engraving of the Yorkshire trophy and to return annual trophies on or before the competition day in the following year. Failure to return a trophy will result in the Club being charged the cost of replacing the trophy.

Clubs must sign the Yorkshire Trophy Book in order to take possession of the Yorkshire Trophies.

# COMPETITION ENTRY & PAYMENT RULES

**IMPORTANT – JUDGE NOMINATIONS ARE ON THE ENTRY VALIDATION FORM ON THE YWAG WEBSITE. PLEASE READ AND COMPLETE THIS CAREFULLY FOR EACH EVENT ENTERED.**

*N.B. Please ensure that you read the guidelines surrounding Late Entries and Judge Nominations as these rules changed for 2026 and can affect entry fees and numbers of gymnasts eligible to enter.*

This section contains rules and entry guidance. Please read carefully when completing your entries.

Full entry fee is required regardless of whether a gymnast is competing all pieces.

## **ATTENDANCE FEES 2026 – YORKSHIRE PEWTER PARTICIPATION**

Individual attendance cost is £25 per gymnast for 2026.

## **ENTRY FEES 2026 - INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS**

Individual entry is £30 per gymnast for 2026 competitions including Yorkshire Pewter

FIG scoring event entry is £25 per gymnast for 2026.

## **ENTRY FEES 2026 - TEAM COMPETITIONS**

### PEWTER, TIN, ZINC & COPPER

Team entry is £180 for a team of 6 gymnasts.

Team entry is £150 for a team of 5 gymnasts.

Team entry is £120 for a team of 4 gymnasts or less.

### BRONZE, SILVER, GOLD AND FIG

Team entry is £150 for a team of 5 gymnasts.

Team entry is £120 for a team of 4 gymnasts.

Team entry is £90 for a team of 3 gymnasts or less.

## **AMENDMENTS AND REFUNDS**

Entry Fees are non-refundable AFTER the closing date

Amendments to the entry before the closing date will be allowed, In the case of withdrawals before the closing date, the entry fee will be refunded.

## **TEAM CHANGES**

Clubs may alter the gymnasts in their team after the closing date without penalty up to 10 days before the competition date, however entry fees are non-refundable. After the 10 days prior to the competition alterations to teams will only be allowed for proven exceptional circumstances such as injury or illness. In the case of proven exceptional circumstances team changes may be made up to the commencement of march on and presentation of the gymnasts but no later.

## ENTRY DEADLINES

**Entry deadlines are stated on the calendar and may vary for different competitions. Please read carefully.**

The WTC will endeavour to send reminders of entry deadlines however these cannot be guaranteed, and it remains the responsibility of the clubs to enter in good time. The Yorkshire WA Competitions will be listed with entry closing dates on the BG event calendar.

The WTC will endeavour to have administration support available as the deadline approaches however this cannot be guaranteed and recommends that clubs enter in good time so that any issues or concerns can be resolved before the entries close.

Entry dates are set to enable an assessment of entry numbers meaning that if competitions need to be moved to an overspill competition this can be advised with plenty of notice.

## ENTRY SYSTEM

**For 2026 the Yorkshire WTC will be using Just Go for the region's entries, Coaches and music in a mp3 format must be included on the entry. The Just Go entry fee is set to zero and payment will continue to be direct into the Yorkshire bank account. (HSBC Sort code 40-27-15 Account 80014958 (Yorkshire Women's tech Competition account) NB if you are having problems with the name please try Yorkshire Gymnastics Association.**

**Entry validation forms to be submitted with entry with nominated judges' names.**

## MUSIC UPLOAD ADMINISTRATION FEE

*Music not submitted in advance and brought to be uploaded on the day will be subject to a £20 administration fee per gymnast. This fee will be donated to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance. It must be paid by cash or BACS transfer at the time of upload. Failure to pay will result in the fee being added to a future competition entry as an additional charge and will be charged with 10% interest making the administration fee £22 per gymnast. ## LATE ENTRIES

**Late entries will only be accepted upon receipt of triple the entry fee.** The competition organiser will have the final say on accepting late entries. Late entries will be considered on application via email to [entryvalidation@yorkshirewagymnastics.org](mailto:entryvalidation@yorkshirewagymnastics.org).

## JUDGE NOMINATIONS

**All clubs when submitting entries must nominate through entry validation on the Yorkshire Website. Judges must have passed a cycle 16 qualification in order to Judge in 2026.**

**Non – completion of the entry validation form will be taken as not nominating judges and will result in a request for the appropriate double entry fees, this includes not nominating a named judge on the entry validation form and will be classed as incomplete.**

**Non – payment of double entry fees or judge levies will result in an invoice for these fees. Non –payment of the invoice may result in future entries being refused until payment is received.**

**The Yorkshire judging requirements are based upon the total number of gymnasts entered into the event (i.e. the total number of gymnasts across all competitions in a weekend).**

**Not supplying the judge quota will result in additional entry fees being payable as per the table below**

regardless of whether the entry has been completed.

The levies are calculated by the number of gymnasts entered into the event at the point entries close unless late entries are accepted. In the case of late entries being accepted, judge requirements and levies will be calculated on the total number of gymnasts including the late entries. The potential need to separate entries into an overflow competition will have no bearing on the judge requirements/levies.

### Judge Quota per Event

Each club entering must nominate the required number of WA judges for every day of the event. An event is the full day or weekend as defined on the BG Entry System and may contain multiple competitions.

### Non – FIG Entry

Individuals: 1 – 11 Gymnasts Teams: Up to 2 Teams	1 judge for 2 days or 2 judges to cover 1 separate day each – minimum WA Club level
Individuals: 12 – 24 Gymnasts Teams: 3- 5 Teams	2 judges for 2 days or 4 judges to cover 1 separate day each - minimum WA Club level
Individuals: 25 + Gymnasts Teams: 6 & 6 Teams	3 judges for 2 days or 6 judges to cover 1 separate day each - minimum 2 x WA Clublevel and minimum 1 x WA Regional Level
<b>Please note when considering judges renewing qualification in cycle 16 that the requirement for Regional Judges has increased. Proof of qualification must be sent to the Judging convenor</b>	

### Regional Judge requirement

If a club is entering a gymnast into any competition that goes through to a National Final or is an FIG event at least one of its judges nominated to meet the quota above must be a minimum of Regional WA qualification.

**Additional information – Regarding nominated judges who are of Compulsory School age, please refer to guidelines set out by your local council and ensure you have a permit if required. It is the responsibility of the club to ensure that they are suitable of the task that they are nominated for.**

### Additional Fees and Judge Levies

Any club not meeting its judging quota will be charged additional entry fees as per the table below:

<b>No Regional Judge for FIG Entry</b>	<b>Double entry fees for all gymnasts</b>

N.B. Non – payment of double entry fees will result in an invoice for these fees. Non – payment of the invoice may result in future entries being refused until payment is received.

### Difficulties Providing Judges

We recognize that the penalties for failure to provide a judge are difficult for clubs that do not have easy access to judges. Unfortunately, the increase in clubs not supplying judges has on occasions put the viability of events into question requiring the WTC to introduce rules to ensure that the quota is met. This is deemed preferable to refusing to allow entries without nominated judges.

There is an **online judging support request form** on the home page WA website to help facilitate obtaining a judge: [yorkshirewagymnastics.org](http://yorkshirewagymnastics.org)

If the club is new to WA or has specific reasons why a judge is not available, please contact the competition organiser via [entryvalidation@yorkshirewagymnastics.org](mailto:entryvalidation@yorkshirewagymnastics.org) who may be able to allocate another role such as welfare officer or first aider to avoid this charge. This is at the discretion of the competition organiser and judging convenor, this would be strictly on a first come first served basis and cannot be guaranteed. Failure to fulfil this commitment would be the equivalent to a judge not fulfilling the commitment and subject to the same additional fees detailed above.

### Nominating Judges from Other Clubs

As judge nomination is no longer through Just Go the following paragraph is no longer relevant, however remains for reference should clubs need to use this process for other Just Go entries.

For Reference Only: Judges who agree to judge for a club can add that club as a secondary affiliation on their Just Go allowing them to be entered on the BG Entry System. There is no limit on these additional affiliations. Additional guidance is also included in the BG Entry System section at the end of this handbook.

### Judges not Meeting Commitments/Quota

If Judges do not turn up or fail to fulfil the judging commitment without valid exception the WTC will invoice the club £200 or additional entry fees as per the table above whichever is the greater. Non – payment of the invoice may result in future entries being refused until payment is received. Extenuating circumstances will be considered on a case by case basis.

### Negating Levies and double entry fee

When clubs are not able to provide a judge or enough judges to meet their quota, clubs must prove that they have made every effort to find a judge e.g. using the judge support request form, contacted the WTC judging coordinator before being offered alternative ways to negate entry fees. In the event that a judge cannot be sourced at all, the club will be expected to send a number of people to help. For example, if 1 to 11 gymnasts are entered, two people for every judge missing will be required to help with the set up on the Friday as well as providing a person or persons for a full weekend on the door, and the pack down, to negate levies and double entry fees.

## COACH NOMINATIONS

### Coach Quota per Competition

The entry system will require the following levels and numbers of coaches to complete the entry.

#### Individual Competitions

1 – 8 Gymnasts	1 x minimum WA Level 2 Coach unless the level of competition specifies a higher qualification.
9 - 16 Gymnasts	2 x minimum WA Level 2 Coach unless the level of competition specifies a higher qualification.
17 +	3 x minimum WA Level 2 Coach unless the level of competition specifies a higher qualification.

#### Team Competitions

Where possible, different teams in the same competition (i.e. same level/grade and same age category) from the same club will be placed in different rounds, however this cannot be guaranteed. As this cannot be guaranteed until the schedule is produced, each team on being entered in a competition will require a different nominated minimum WA Level 2 Coach or higher where the level of competition specifies a higher qualification.

## Coach Qualification by Competition

The minimum qualification for a coach responsible for gymnasts at a Yorkshire WA Competition or Event is WA Level 2.

The minimum qualification to be in the arena is a BG recognised Level 1 Qualification.

WA Level 1s or coaches with qualifications in other disciplines (regardless of the level of qualification in the other discipline) may only be in the arena if accompanied by a WA Level 2 or above and may only provide pastoral care such as holding numbers or sitting with gymnasts.

WA Level 1s or coaches with qualifications in other disciplines (regardless of the level of qualification in the other discipline) may not be present on the podium at any time and may not stand in or support any skills in competition.

Coaches may only remain in the arena if they are able to provide verification of their qualification, a current DBS and a current safeguarding qualification, which have been added through Gymnet prior to the event. Clubs that fail to nominate the coaches that will be in attendance, will not be accepted on the floor as per National event registration.

The responsibility and liability remains with the club for ensuring that coaches are suitably WA qualified to cover gymnasts' skills and that the gymnast and coach are suitably insured. The responsibility remains with the clubs for arranging cover for skills, where needed, with alternative WA qualified coaches.

Yorkshire WA Competitions require that a suitably qualified coach is present at the piece during the performance of the skills. The coach must be an active coach and cannot be a judge, spectator or official during the remainder of the competition.

BG lead coach rules apply for BG National qualification competitions only. In this instance, if the coach is operating under the BG lead coach/supervising coach rules **this must be informed in writing to the WTC prior to the competition with the written consent of the lead coach also supplied.** Please remember that the BG rules require that the supervising coach can be no more than one level lower and must have attended the course for the skills that they are supervising. [See Appendix for application forms.](#)

## CHANGES TO PUBLISHED COMPETITIONS

Competition Dates will be adhered to wherever possible. However, the WTC reserves the right to change competition details as follows:

- if entries are over-subscribed, additional days may be added. Conversely if entries are small, competitions may be reduced to one day;
- if BG changes its dates;
- if unforeseen circumstances dictate a change in date/venue.

The WTC reserves the right to change the working order to maintain a regular competition structure format. All gymnasts and coaches must arrive in good time to register for their competition.

The WTC reserves the right to commence the competition early providing all gymnasts are registered or registration has closed.

Gymnasts must remain in the arena from registration to the start of their competition. Gymnasts must attend the presentation ceremony as per FIG regulations section 2 page 3 2022 COP. In line with the FIG COP if gymnasts do not attend the presentation, they will not receive trophies or medals unless competitions are split over multiple rounds. In these circumstances coaches may collect awards if gymnasts are not present.

# YORKSHIRE WA REGIONAL COMPETITION RULES

## FLOOR MUSIC

The following music is not allowed: Cirque du Soleil, Disney, Walt Disney, Andrew Lloyd Webber unless identified as registered on PPL in line with British Gymnastics regulations. For any clarification, please consult BG and the PPL Website [www.ppluk.com](http://www.ppluk.com)

Each different piece of music should be submitted with the entry using the online entry system. Where a CD is necessary, each different piece of music must be supplied on a separate CD or other reliable and effective format and a duplicate should be available. Please check with the organiser which formats are available. All music should be labelled with the gymnast's name. Music length is as per the Yorkshire competition rules, this may be shorter than the FIG maximum 90 seconds but will never be longer.

## MOBILE PHONES

Apart from where required for the running of the competition (WTC Officials and Competition Organisers) gymnasts, judges and officials **MUST NOT use mobile phones or devices in the competition arena as per BG guidelines.**

## PARENTS AT EVENTS

All Clubs take responsibility for the actions of their parents. No parent is allowed on the competition arena and must not approach active coaches or judges. In the event of a child welfare issue the designated welfare officer should be alerted.

## USE OF PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEO/DIGITAL CAMERA EQUIPMENT

The use of flash photography and video whilst the gymnasts are performing their routines or during the warm-up sessions is not allowed in the arena by anyone.

## SPECTATOR ENTRY FEE

Spectators will be charged an entrance fee at the venue as follows:

- 1 day ticket - Adult £10 or Child / OAP £5
- 2 day ticket - Adult £17.50 or Child / OAP £8

It is the club's responsibility to inform parents of this charge. This fee may vary according to the size / price of the venue. **Siblings who compete on separate weekends in corresponding competitions will receive free entry to watch their sibling. Eg sibling 1 competes at the Classic Challenge (September) and sibling 2 competes at Pewter (October).**

## YORKSHIRE WOMENS ARTISTIC WEBSITE

Updates and information for Coaches and Judges can be found on the on the YWAG Website.

## WORKING ORDER

### Individual competitions

1. Competitors compete in programmed numerical order.
2. Competitors advance one place in the order of competing and the first competitor becomes last competitor in each subsequent apparatus in the working order.
3. The working order of individuals is determined by the competition organiser to provide the most effective use of time and circulated approximately 2 weeks prior to competition.
4. Withdrawn gymnasts are discounted from the competition working order.

## Team competitions

1. Teams compete in programmed order.
2. Gymnasts in a team compete in their coach's preferred order (team working order).
3. The team working order must be completed on the system at registration before registration closes.
4. Teams withdrawn from the competition are discounted from the competition working order.

## COMPETITION ETIQUETTE

Yorkshire Women's Artistic Competitions operate within BG and FIG guidelines and rules regarding competition etiquette, welfare and codes of conduct. Please refer to FIG Code of Points and British Gymnastics Guidance.

## RESPONSIBILITY OF PARTICIPATING CLUBS

In order to succeed as a region, teamwork is needed throughout. It is anticipated that each Club entered in the competition will be responsible for providing some of the volunteers that will be needed for the successful running of the competition.

Duties may include Runners, Timekeepers, Catering, Scorer, Door People, Raffle Running, this is not an exhaustive list. The exact roles needed will depend on the competition and venue.

The WTC would really appreciate where possible support of setting up the equipment on the Friday from 1pm onwards and for clubs in the final round to have a minimum of two volunteers to help with the put down at the end of the weekend.

## APPEALS AND FEEDBACK

A coach has a right to receive a D score and overall score for each performance prior to the presentation excepting the Yorkshire Pewter Participation event where no scores will be issued.

A coach can appeal against a particular 'D' score. The protest must be submitted in writing to the Competition Organiser giving the gymnast's name and number, apparatus and the technical reason for the protest. The appropriate fee of £5 should accompany it. Any protest must be submitted before 15 minutes has elapsed since the score has been presented to the coach. The fee will be returned to the coach if the mark is amended.

Optional pre-printed forms to help coaches structure an appeal are available at competitions.

**No score should be discussed during the competition. It should be with the head judge only.**

If a score is discussed with the judges prior to an appeal, then an appeal may not be made.

Coaches are allowed to ask for feedback about scores with the Head Judge **at the end of the competition**, only if there is time and the judge is happy to give feedback. Coaches should always be polite and courteous. Under no circumstances should coaches approach judges with video footage of routines.

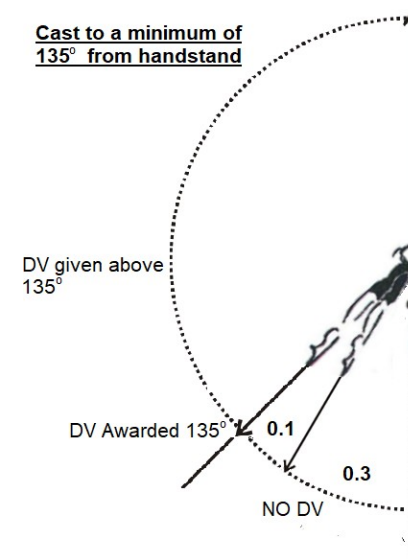

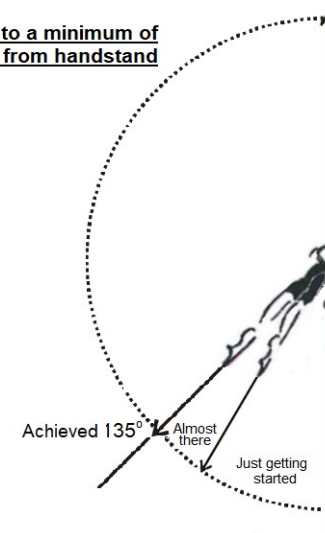

# GYMNAST REGULATIONS AND RULES

## GYMNASTS' AGES

Gymnasts' ages will be the age reached in the year of competition. Competition Year is 1<sup>st</sup> January –31<sup>st</sup> December - See Age chart at the beginning of the handbook for year of birth calculator.

## MEMBERSHIP

All gymnasts must be a minimum SILVER member of a BG registered Club and affiliated to Yorkshire Gymnastics to enter into competitive events. Participation events only require **Bronze membership**. Gymnasts' membership and insurance must be current and up to date.

## DRESS CODE OF GYMNASTS

All gymnasts are expected to be correctly dressed as defined by the F.I.G code of points. This permits the wearing of a catsuit or footless tights as long as they are skin tight and the same colour as the leotard. **Gymnasts who choose to wear shorts do not require them to be the same colour as per BG rule and will not receive any deduction.**

No visible branding on shorts or leggings is permitted, for example lettering around the waist or diamante names on shorts etc.

For the latest rules on jewellery, please refer to the Health & Safety Guidance: Coaching Practice policy on the BG website.

No chewing gum.

No mobile phones or devices allowed in the competition arena.

Handguards, body bandages and wrist wraps are permitted. They must be securely fastened, in good repair and should not detract from the aesthetics of the performance. Bandages **MUST** be skin-coloured or beige as per the FIG code.

**In line with British Gymnastics guidance, hair must be secured to ensure that it does not touch the floor when the gymnast is in handstand.**

## TALL GYMNASTS

Both bars may be raised by 5cm where a gymnast's feet touch the basic matting while she is hanging on high bar or hips touch the basic matting while she is hanging on low bar.

Where a single bar is used, this may be raised so that the gymnast's feet in long hang clear the matting.

The request for the bars to be raised must be made with the competition entry. Please see section on how to use the BG Entry System showing how to request a bar raise (Page 37). If the bar is raised without prior request the gymnast will carry the penalty as per the FIG Code of Points.

As per British Gymnastics, requests for raised bar may be checked by the head judge on bars.

## GYMNASTS ORDER OF PERFORMANCE

# COACHES REGULATIONS AND RULES

## LEAD AND SUPERVISING COACHES

Yorkshire WA Competitions require that a suitably qualified coach is present at the piece during the performance of the skills. The coach must be an active coach and cannot be a judge, spectator or official during the remainder of the competition. In order to accompany and have responsibility for gymnasts, coaches must be qualified to coach the skills in their gymnasts' routines and meet the coach requirements for the competition as detailed in Coach Nominations on page 15.

BG lead coach rules apply for **BG National qualification competitions only**. In this instance, if the coach is operating under the BG lead coach/supervising coach rules this must be informed in writing to the WTC prior to the competition with the written consent of the lead coach also supplied. Please remember that the BG rules require that the supervising coach can be no more than one level lower and must have attended the course for the skills that they are supervising.

Lead or supervising Coaches must have current Gold, Joint Gold or Life members of BG and be qualified to the level of the moves being performed before being allowed to participate in a Regional Competition. They must have a current BG specific DBS certificate. The minimum level of coach that can take responsibility for gymnasts in any level of competition is **WA** Level 2 or equivalent.

The responsibility and liability remains with the club for ensuring that coaches are suitably qualified to cover gymnasts' skills and that the gymnast and coach are suitably insured. The responsibility remains with the clubs for arranging cover for skills, where needed, with alternative coaches.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

Assistant Coaches may only provide pastoral care, move the equipment, adjust apparatus, and present the gymnast's competition number.

Assistant Coaches must be a minimum Level 1 coach and have minimum Silver membership before being allowed to enter the competition arena.

Coaches qualified at Level 1 or above in other gymnastics disciplines can act as assistant coaches.

Coaches qualified in other disciplines can ONLY act as assistant coaches regardless of the level of qualification in the other discipline.

## BG MEMBERSHIP, DBS AND SAFEGUARDING

All coaches must produce evidence of current BG Membership, DBS, Safeguarding and Qualifications at Coach Registration and have this evidence available on request whilst in the Competition Arena. Yorkshire WTC have introduced an opt in verification passcard system. A current YWTC passcard is acceptable evidence. If a coach does not have a current YWTC passcard, another form of photo id must be provided such as a driving licence along with evidence of membership, DBS, Safeguarding and Qualifications. In the interest of fairness, this rule will be applied to all coaches equally.

## COACH NUMBERS ON THE COMPETITION FLOOR

In individual competitions, one coach per gymnast will be allowed in the competition arena.

In team competitions a max of two coaches per team are allowed in the arena at any one time (Assistant Coaches count towards this number). Coaches exceeding this number will be asked to sit out of the Arena. One female coach and/or one male coach is permitted, or two female coaches.

It is the club's responsibility to ensure there are sufficient coaches from their club to supervise the number of gymnasts / groups entered in the competition.

## DUTY OF CARE AND WARM UP

Coaches have a duty of care towards their performers and have responsibility to ensure that they are both qualified and competent to teach at the appropriate level, as well as ensuring that the participant is adequately prepared, physically and psychologically, for performing their routines in a competition situation.

A gymnast will not be allowed to warm up without a coach. Late arrivals will only be accommodated at the discretion of the competition organiser.

## SAFEGUARDING

As of the 1st January 2013, all coaches taking part in any Yorkshire Regional, British Gymnastics National or International competition will be required to hold an up to date BG recognised Safeguarding and Protecting Children training certificate. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in you not being permitted to enter the competition as a coach.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

The safety of all participants (gymnasts, coaches and officials) is the primary consideration. All British Gymnastics policies and procedures will be rigorously applied with regards to health, safety and welfare and child protection.

## CODE OF CONDUCT

As defined by the FIG Code of Points – infringements will be penalised as detailed in the Code including the issuing of Red and Yellow cards. It is recommended that all coaches read section 8 of the FIG Code of Points for further guidance.

## COMPETITION ATTIRE - COACHES

Appropriate competition, gymnastic attire of club t-shirt or polo shirt, full length tracksuit and suitable footwear/trainers. Any coach not appropriately attired will be asked to leave the arena until correctly attired. This is in line with BG policy. If garments are not listed then they are not acceptable for safety and insurance reasons e.g. sliders, crocs, baseball caps and hoodies are not acceptable. Leggings are only allowed if full length, plain and in a suitable thick dark material (i.e. not see-through material, or inappropriate patterns or colours). Tracksuit bottoms with ankle cuffs are allowed but should be true tracksuit bottoms and not jogging bottoms.

### **Long hair must be tied back.**

Coaches will NOT be allowed on the competition floor if wearing jewellery (ear studs are permitted, wedding rings if taped).

No chewing gum.

**The taking of photographs in the field of play and on the equipment is not permitted. Clubs and coaches are encouraged to use the allocated banner area or any other appropriate that does not include the field of play.**

## **APPARATUS**

Should a coach consider a piece of apparatus unsafe or to have inadequate matting, this should be discussed with the Head Judge. Where no agreement can be reached, the Competition Organiser will be the final arbitrator and his/her decision is final.

**UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCE SHOULD APPARATUS BE MOVED OR ALTERED WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE COMPETITION ORGANISERS OR THE HEAD JUDGE ON THAT PIECE.**

## **APPEALS AND FEEDBACK**

Please see guidance on page 17.

**If it is found that a club is in breach of the policies above the WTC Chairperson reserves the right to reject an entry on the grounds of gymnast safety.**

## RESPONSIBILITY OF JUDGING CONVENOR AND JUDGES

Judges operate at all times under the FIG COP Regulations for Judges (Section 5) and the Judges' oath.

*“In the name of all the Judges and Officials, I promise that we shall officiate in these competitions with complete impartiality, respecting and abiding by the rules which govern them, in the true spirit of sportsmanship.”*

1. All judges must be appropriate members of B.G.
2. Judges must wear the recognised F.I.G uniform.
3. Judges must attend the judges' meeting prior to the competition and be registered. The meeting is called by the Judging Convenor. The meeting will be chaired by the person nominated by the Judging Convenor.
4. Master/Head Judge of the event should check the apparatus before the competition along with the competition organiser(s).
5. The Head Judge of each apparatus panel will preside over a conference of the other panel judges to confer when a difference/split in scores so requires.
6. When leaving his/her seat, a judge must notify the Head Judge of their panel.
7. Judges should not communicate with coaches or spectators about aspects of performance, scores or other matters relevant to the competition in hand from the commencement of the Judges Meeting until the end of the competition.
8. Judges approached by coaches, gymnasts or parents in anyway outside of the rules of the competition must advise the Head Judge of their panel.
9. At all times judges must be impartial and unbiased. In the interests of fair play being seen to be done, judges must conduct themselves in a professional and unbiased manner throughout the duration of the competition.
10. In the event of a coach registering a protest regarding a D score received on a particular piece of apparatus, the Head Judge in consultation with the other judges, will review the routine and the score awarded and reply to the protest in writing.

## DUTIES OF THE COMPETITION ORGANISERS

1. Receive from clubs all entries and appropriate fees in accordance with the competition entry rules.
2. To draw up a working order, prepare a printed programme and circulate it to the competing clubs at least 14 days prior to the competition.
3. On receipt of entries submit a list of nominated judges from the club entries to the Judging Convenor.
4. Obtain medals and trophies and request the return of trophies.
5. Organise all apparatus, public address system, officials, and assistants for the competition, and obtain as much assistance as necessary to run a competition. Liaise with the venue of the competition as necessary.
6. To liaise with the announcer, scorers, coaches, judges and runners to ensure the smooth running of the competition.
7. To ensure the competition rules and conditions are observed.
8. To convene a meeting of Head Judges and WTC members in attendance to deal with any problems or misconduct at any time in the competition, should it be necessary.
9. To receive written enquires about the D score from coaches pertaining to a gymnast's score, give them to the appropriate Head Judge and return the reply to the coach concerned.
10. Pay all eligible judges' expenses.
11. Submit to the Treasurer within 4 weeks of the competition a balance sheet of all income and expenditure incurred for the competition.
12. Provide a copy of all scores at the end of the competition. This must be given to the named coach of the club.

**The Association, acting through the Competition Organisers or Chairperson of the Women's Technical Committee, reserves the right to refuse any entry and to disqualify a competitor or team, if it is proved that an entry is not in accordance with the conditions of the competition.**

# APPARATUS REGULATIONS

All Levels will use the FIG specifications where possible unless stated otherwise on the competition criteria. These can be downloaded from the FIG Website.

## VAULT:

1. For round off entry vaults, the safety collar **MUST** be in place.
2. 20cm FIG specification matting + 10 cm supplementary matting with markings as specified for vault landing.
3. Maximum run allowed 25 metres.

## BARS:

1. Low bar 175cm / High bar 255cm (both +/- 1 cm) from the floor to the top side of the bars.
2. Maximum width between bars, inside bars on diagonal is 182cm.
3. 20cm FIG specification matting with 10cm supplementary matting.
4. The take- off board may be placed on the supplementary mat.
5. The supplementary mat may **NOT** be moved during the exercise.
6. Bars may be raised by 5cm if requested at the time of entry and in line with FIG apparatus regulations. Unauthorized raising of the bars will be penalized in accordance with the FIG regulations.

## BEAM:

1. 125cm from the floor to the top of beam.
2. 20cm FIG specification matting with 10cm supplementary landingmat.
3. The supplementary mat may not be moved during the exercise.

## FLOOR:

1. 12m x 12m FIG specification floor area.

## COACHES AT APPARATUS

BEAM: A coach may approach the apparatus for BEAM DISMOUNTS ONLY. This does not permit the coach to touch the gymnast during her routine unless to prevent an accident. ***The coach must not move along in line with the gymnast during the routine or remain on the podium.***

BARS: The coach may remain at the apparatus and stand between the bars if required throughout the routine and, as above, should not touch the gymnast during the exercise. A second coach may be present to remove the board.

At other times coaches must remain in the designated area during performances. Infringements will penalise coach and/or gymnast as per FIG regulations.

## UNSPORTSMAN LIKE BEHAVIOUR OF COACH OR GYMNAST

Infringements will penalise coach and/or gymnast as per FIG regulations. (Yellow / Red Cards)

## CODES OF CONDUCT

Anyone participating or attending a Yorkshire Gymnastics Association Women's Artistic Competition or Event in any capacity agrees to and is bound at all times by the:

- Yorkshire Women's Artistic (WTC) Codes of Conduct;
- Yorkshire Gymnastics Association (YGA) Codes of Conduct;
- British Gymnastics (BG) Codes of Conduct;
- Fédération Internationale de Gymnastique (FIG) Codes of Conduct.

## 2026 Yorkshire WAG Regional Squad Selection Policy

It was agreed by the Yorkshire Women's Technical Committee on the 10th of November that the following criteria will be used to select the 2026 Regional Squad:

- Scored 41.5 or more at a regional or national FIG event in 2025
- Scored 55.25 or more at Excel 3 in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Scored 56.35 or more at Excel 2 in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Scored 43.7 or more at FIG Development 3 in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Scored 43.65 or more at FIG Development 2 in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Scored TBC or more at Classic Challenge Gold in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Scored TBC or more at Classic Challenge Silver in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Achieved a 'working above' at Performance 4 in 2025 (regional event only)
- Achieved a 'working beyond' at Performance 3 in 2025 (regional event only)

All scores are based on the mid field of national events to encourage Yorkshire clubs to aspire to achieve this quality of work at any level.

Gymnasts who are selected for a WAG national squad have an automatic place in our Regional Squad and will have the opportunity to accept or decline their place prior to other positions being offered.

Gymnasts who meet the following criteria will be invited for assessment on Sunday the 11th of January 2026:

- Achieved 'working beyond' at Excel 1 in 2025 (regional event)
- Achieved a 'working beyond' at Performance 2 in 2025 (regional event only)
- Achieved a 'working beyond' at Performance 1 in 2025 (regional event only)
- Scored TBC or more at Classic Challenge Bronze in 2025 (regional or national event)
- Anyone who accepted a squad place in 2025 who has not met the criteria for reselection
- Anyone who has represented Yorkshire at a national event in 2025 who has not met the criteria for selection.

This selection policy is subject to change year on year.

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## **WTC Policy for Lead Coach Roles, Working Orders and Piece Selection 2024**

### Team Lead Coach Allocation

The WTC have agreed that the allocation of Lead Coaches should be a transparent, published process decided by WTC to facilitate harmonious relations between clubs and coaches. After extensive discussion, it was proposed and voted through that the coach be allocated using the following formula. It was agreed that this would be a standard process that would apply to all Yorkshire teams for the remainder of 2024.

- 1) The coach with the most gymnasts in the team (based on the gymnasts' club affiliation)
- 2) If point one does not apply then the coach with the highest qualifications
- 3) If point one and two do not apply then the coach with the gymnast with the highest all-around score.

The WTC officers running the training will have the information to enable coaches to be allocated.

### Team Lead Coach Responsibilities

- 1) Responsible for making sure all Gymnasts are registered
- 2) Responsible for inputting team working order
- 3) Responsible for notifying the Chair of the WTC of any changes to working order or piece selection. Changes are only allowed with the express agreement of all coaches affected.
- 4) Gymnasts attire prior to start – requirements are Yorkshire tracksuit, sleeveless Yorkshire leotard for warm up where appropriate, long sleeved Yorkshire leotard for competing.
- 5) Dealing with complaints from BG and also for challenging SV.

Please be aware that, if a coach fails to fulfil the agreed Team Lead Coach responsibilities, they will not be allocated the position in the next competition year.

### Working Order

Wherever possible all coaches will be present at Team Training and this will be agreed by the coaches attending these events.

Changes can be requested by coaches and providing all coaches are in agreement these changes can be made.

These must be notified to the Chair of the WTC.

The coaches' input is welcomed in recognition of their knowledge of their gymnasts. No coach including the lead coach can make changes affecting gymnasts from another club without the express agreement of the coach of that gymnasts and the change and agreement must be notified to the WTC.

Any disputes will be settled by the Chair of the WTC, where agreement cannot be reached the decision will default back to the working order agreed at team training. The Chair's decision will be final in these matters.



## Gymnast Funding Policy for International events 2025

Gymnasts and Coaches that find themselves successful in selection to represent BG, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales or any other Country in International events, such as the Olympics, Worlds and World Student Games, Europeans, Commonwealth games and any other international event, the gymnasts / coaches will be eligible for financial support whereby the governing body of that country has failed to award all if any funds to the nominated gymnast or coach.

### Criteria for funding

- Proof of non or part funding must be presented to the WTC.
- Considerations for funding will also be determined by what the gymnast / coach has been selected for e.g. is it a team event whereby the gymnast has been selected as a specialist within the team, is it an AA event whereby the gymnast is mandated to perform all apparatus.
- The family, club and gymnast must attempt to fundraise primarily for the event, the WTC permits the use of tags on our social media pages to increase traffic towards the funding pages.
- In the event that the club has multiple gymnasts requiring funds for the same event, however, are in a different discipline's the club must be able to prove that that have equally provided the same amount of funds to each of the gymnasts and not solely rely on the WTC to fund more than is required.
- If the total amount is not achieved a breakdown of the costs must be sent to the WTC to see what, if possible, would be recoverable in the event of injury, illness and complete non-attendance.
- The WTC may consider making an agreement based on recoverable costs, e.g. if there is any form of insurance in place for cancelled or delayed flights etc.
- The amount awarded by the WTC is at the discretion of the WTC based on the effort to fundraise, the importance of the competition, proven pre competition results, including the consideration if the person requiring funding has supported the WTC in technical roll presently or in the past.
- The WTC would expect in return the following –  
Acknowledgement of sponsor ship on social media posts linked and associated with the event, results post from the gymnast and the club. For the gymnast / coach to attend a number of competitions to award medals  
e.g. £100 to £750 a minimum of 1 event  
£751 – to £1500 a minimum of 2 events  
£1501 or more a minimum of 3 events over a two-year period  
Alternatively attend the regional squad sessions and run a Warmup or conditioning session to encourage and support the next generation of gymnasts.  
Be available to sign autographs at any of the above events and attend in International Kit.



## **Brevet judges funding Autumn 2025 and onwards**

The Brevet judging course funding policy is to promote and support judges who want to further their education, with the aim to support the region at qualification events, to judge on behalf of the region at competitions where Yorkshire is being represented, assist the region with trials and events where judging is required and continue to be prepared to judge nationally to maintain and gain information for the region's benefit.

Funding for a Brevet judging course taking place after April 2025 should be applied for prior to booking on the course if financial help is required.

### **Policy clauses**

1. The granting of funding to any person under this policy will be at the discretion of the WTC, however funding will not be unreasonably withheld.

2. Funding for any Brevet judge who has paid for the Brevet course and associated costs themselves on a previous cycle prior to cycle 16 and have judged in the region at the FIG and qualifying events and or have made significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in the last cycle, or exceptionally, have undertaken other competition roles impacting on their availability to judge at competitions.

2.1 Applicants will be deemed to have met this requirement if they have judged at / fulfilled a specific competition role at 75% of competition in the previous calendar year. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

2.2 Successful applicants will receive funding of the full course fee, shared accommodation costs, (or 50% of the costs of a single room) and mileage @ 45p per mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

3. Funding for any other Brevet judge who has paid for the Brevet course and associated costs themselves on a previous cycle prior to cycle 16 but have NOT judged the required number of qualification or FIG events in this cycle or contributed to the region in a judging capacity or met the other criteria above. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

3.1 Successful applicants will receive funding of 75% of the course fee and 75% of joint accommodation (or 37.5% of the costs of a single room) and mileage at 30p a mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

4. Funding for current national judges who have judged in the FIG and qualifying events or have made a significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in the last cycle. Applicants must have held the national judging award for a minimum of two cycles and have made a significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in that cycle, or exceptionally, have undertaken other competition

roles impacting on their availability to judge at competitions. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

4.1 Successful applicants will receive funding of 75% of the course fee and 75% of joint accommodation costs (or 37.5% of the cost of a single room) and mileage at 30p per mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

5. Agreed funding will be paid after completion of the course and on submission of the correct invoices and mileage claim. Where funding has been agreed and the applicant fails to attend the course the funding WILL NOT be paid.

6. Where the applicant does not pass the course no costs in relation to a resit will be paid.

7. Successful applicants will be expected to make an ongoing significant contribution to judging in the region, as defined at 2.1 above. The WTC reserves the right to reclaim funding where this expectation is not met.



## National judges funding 2025 and onwards

The National judging course funding policy is to promote and support judges who want to further their education, support the region at qualification events and are prepared to judge nationally to gain further judging knowledge and experience.

Funding for a National judging course taking place after April 2025 should be applied for prior to - booking on the course, without exception. Those who have already paid for and attended the April 2025 National judging course are able to request funding retrospectively.

### Policy clauses

1. The granting of funding to any person under this policy will be at the discretion of the WTC, however funding will not be unreasonably withheld.

2. Funding for any National judge who has paid for the National course and associated costs themselves on a previous cycle prior to cycle 16 and have judged in the region at the FIG and qualifying events and or have made significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in the last cycle, or exceptionally, have undertaken other competition roles impacting on their availability to judge at competitions.

2.1 Applicants will be deemed to have met this requirement if they have judged at / fulfilled a specific competition role at 75% of competition in the previous calendar year. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

2.2 Successful applicants will receive funding of the full course fee (currently £140), shared accommodation costs, (or 50% of the costs of a single room) and mileage @ 45p per mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

3. Funding for any other National judge who has paid for the National course and associated costs themselves on a previous cycle prior to cycle 16 but have NOT judged the required qualification or FIG events in this cycle or contributed to the region in a judging capacity or met the other criteria above. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

3.1 Successful applicants will receive funding of 75% of the course fee and 75% of joint accommodation (or 37.5% of the costs of a single room) and mileage at 30p a mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

4. Funding for current regional judges who have judged in the FIG and qualifying events or have made a significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in the last cycle. Applicants must have held the regional judging award for a minimum of one full cycle and have made a significant contribution to the region in a judging capacity in that cycle, or exceptionally, have undertaken other

competition roles impacting on their availability to judge at competitions. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

4.1 Successful applicants will receive funding of 75% of the course fee and 75% of joint accommodation costs (or 37.5% of the cost of a single room) and mileage at 30p per mile, at the discretion of the WTC. It is expected that, where possible, transport will be shared.

5. Agreed funding will be paid after completion of the course and on submission of the correct invoices and mileage claim. Where funding has been agreed and the applicant fails to attend the course the funding WILL NOT be paid.

6. Where the applicant does not pass the course no costs in relation to a resit will be paid.

7. Successful applicants will be expected to make an ongoing significant contribution to judging in the region, as defined at 2.1 above. The WTC reserves the right to reclaim funding where this expectation is not met.

## Yorkshire Gymnastics (National representation)

### Code of Conduct for Coaches Representing Yorkshire at Competitions

This Code of Conduct sets out the standards expected of all coaches representing Yorkshire at competitions. It is based on the British Gymnastics Standards of Conduct for Coaches, Instructors & Officials (2020) and applies in addition to all British Gymnastics regulations and policies. Failure to adhere to this Code may result in disciplinary action by Yorkshire Gymnastics, in line with British Gymnastics' Complaints and Disciplinary Procedures.

#### 1. General Responsibilities

- Coaches are ambassadors of Yorkshire Gymnastics and must uphold the highest standards of conduct, behaviour, and professionalism at all times.
- Coaches must comply with British Gymnastics policies, including safeguarding, health and safety, anti-doping, and social media guidelines.
- Coaches must act in accordance with all legal obligations and the rules of the sport.

#### 2. Personal Behaviour

- Display integrity, respect, and self-discipline at all times.
- Dress appropriately for competitions, reflecting safety, professionalism, and Yorkshire pride.
- Refrain from consuming alcohol, drugs, or any substance that could impair judgment or performance while representing Yorkshire.
- Do not smoke or vape whilst coaching or in the presence of gymnasts at events.
- Avoid offensive, aggressive, or discriminatory language or behaviour in any form, including jokes, gestures, or social media activity.
- Refrain from bullying, harassment, or discrimination based on gender, age, ethnicity, religion, disability, or any other protected characteristic.

#### 3. Competition Conduct

- Show respect for all gymnasts, coaches, judges, officials, volunteers, and spectators.
- Accept results, victory, and defeat with dignity and professionalism.
- Do not challenge or undermine officials' decisions except through accepted procedures.
- Do not engage in bribery, result manipulation, or any form of corruption.
- Ensure that Yorkshire gymnasts' performances are discussed constructively and privately, never in a public or inappropriate setting.

#### 4. Safeguarding

- Prioritise the welfare, safety, and wellbeing of all gymnasts.
- Never misuse positions of trust or authority.
- Report immediately any concerns regarding the safety or welfare of children or vulnerable adults, in line with British Gymnastics Safeguarding Policy.
- Cooperate fully with safeguarding investigations.

- Do not victimise or discourage individuals who raise concerns.

#### 5. Coaching Responsibilities

- Only coach skills and disciplines for which you are qualified and competent. It is the clubs responsibility to ensure whoever is the designated coach for a gymnast holds the correct qualification.
- Respect gymnasts' home coaches and clubs. Do not coach gymnasts from other clubs without prior agreement.
- Encourage teamwork and cooperation across Yorkshire representatives, avoiding divisive or competitive behaviour between clubs.
- Never engage in harmful practices such as inappropriate weighing, body shaming, or restricting access to food and fluids.
- Accept responsibility for the behaviour and welfare of gymnasts under your supervision.

#### 6. Representation & Reputation

- Always act in a manner that upholds the reputation of Yorkshire Gymnastics and the sport of gymnastics as a whole.
- Do not misrepresent your qualifications or position.
- Do not claim to represent British Gymnastics, a Home Nation, or any other body without proper authorisation.

#### 7. Confidentiality

- Respect the confidentiality of information concerning gymnasts, coaches, and officials, except where safeguarding concerns require disclosure.

#### Declaration

By representing Yorkshire at competitions, coaches agree to uphold this Code of Conduct and the values of integrity, respect, inclusivity, and excellence.
